



Kingston must retain its character as a Living country village

Minutes of the meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan Task Group (NPTG) held on 9 April 2020. As a consequence of the Covid 19 restrictions imposed by HM Government, the meeting was conducted by Zoom in accordance with Kingston Parish Council process.

1. Present, apologies and declarations of interest.

3. The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed as a correct record.

4. Matters arising

This section was specific to the process of detailed review and completion of the draft Neighbourhood Plan for submission at Regulation 15 stage. A full review was taken of the Plan to date, (*including all text, appendices, layout, photographs and illustrations*) to agree final proposed changes, printing process and submission of the draft. This is a time consuming and painstaking but essential process. Amendments agreed will be made and the proposed final version with amendments agreed recorded separately from these minutes. NPTG will advise parishioners once the final draft has been submitted for However, NPTG has received the following guidance, which will impact on the timescale”

Regulations linked to the Coronavirus Act 2020 mean that no elections or referendums can take place until 6 May 2021. This includes neighbourhood planning referendums. These provisions will be kept under review and may be amended or revoked in response to changing circumstances.

• The measures will mean that some neighbourhood plans will come into force later than they would have done.

• We understand this will be frustrating for communities that have dedicated significant time and effort to the neighbourhood planning process and naturally want their plans to come into force as soon as possible.

• With this in mind, we have updated current planning guidance to set out that neighbourhood plans awaiting referendums can be given significant weight in decision-making.
